

GAHWNY General Meeting – Chautauqua Institute – September 24, 2011

Meeting opened at 11:53 a.m.

Sue Conklin, GAHWNY Chair, brought the meeting to order and asked the group to go over minutes from the spring meeting. Vote to approve minutes, by Scott Benz; seconded by Lorna Spencer all in favor, approved.

Sue brought up the scholarship idea to put some of our funds to good use. \$200 could be given to each school for a student who is transferring from a SUNY college to regular college for history. Amie suggested it should be part of our mission to bring in young people and get them interested in history. The schools will pick the recipient.

Sue brought up the idea of another field trip for discussion. Only four historians went on the last one. It was decided to drop the idea because feasibility in this economy is too costly.
